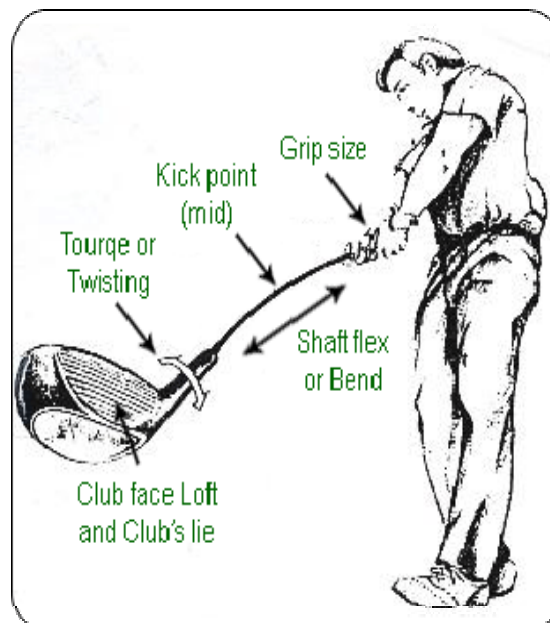


Club Fitting & Repairs

Bonville Academy of Golf boasts a full golf club repair and customization fitting centre to be able to give you a comprehensive service that ensures that your clubs give you the best chance to play your best golf.

Having the right equipment set up to your individual specifics is central to being able to play to your full potential and lower your scores on a regular basis. The simplest of things such as incorrect grip size or shaft flex can cause many swing faults that will prevent you from being able to hit the ball consistently straight and long. Whilst not keeping your equipment in the best of conditions, such as worn or slippery grips and pitted shafts will create further problems which will all add to higher numbers on your scorecard.

All of our staff are PGA Qualified where they have gained extensive knowledge in how to make all manner of repairs to clubs and how to analyze individuals requirements; including determining the correct club length for you, the loft and lie, shaft material, weight and flex, club swing weight and grip size. Club Length: By measuring your height and finger tip-to-floor measurements. We can determine how much longer or shorter (than standard) your club length should be. Whilst we recommend you use standard clubs when ever possible, some players do require longer or shorter clubs to help maintain there posture through out there swing.

Lie Angle: The lie angle of your club determines how square the base of the club impacts the ground. A lie angle that has the toe of the club head to high in the air may result in shots that are pulled, or go to the left for right-handed players. A lie angle that has the toe digging in to the ground may result in shots that are pushed, or go to the right for right-handed players. Having clubs that are at the proper lie, can ensure that your shot pattern and shot shapes are as consistent as possible.

Shaft Flex: Correct shaft flex is primarily determined by the club head speed generated by the player. The shaft flex is the indication of how much swing force is necessary to make the shaft perform properly. If a shaft is too stiff, the player will have difficulty flexing it during the swing. This may result in reduced distance and shots going to the right. If a shaft is too flexible, the player may have difficulty controlling the club head. This may result in either sliced or hooked shots.

Grip Size: If you are using grips that are too thick or to thin. Your hands may be unable to roll through the ball correctly, causing manufactured and controlled swings. The correct grip thickness will allow your swing to flow more naturally with the momentum of the golf club.

Club Repair: If your grips need replacing or you have just had a moment of frustration and your club is now in two halves.
